



# BFHE Issues Special Resolution in Support of EDCOM 2 Reforms

In a united move to strengthen the quality of Philippine education, the Bikol Foundation for Higher Education (BFHE) has officially expressed its support for the Second Congressional Commission on Education (EDCOM 2) through the issuance of a special resolution.

The resolution signals the collective commitment of higher education institutions in the Bicol Region to back EDCOM 2's efforts in identifying and addressing longstanding educational issues across the country.

"The #EDCOMYearTwoReport has comprehensively identified the challenges and opportunities within the Philippine education system, providing evidence-based recommendations for reforms," the report emphasized.

The BFHE's resolution is seen as a crucial endorsement from the academic sector, as it reinforces the need for a science- and data-driven approach to educational reforms, grounded in the realities of regional and national contexts.
