# TRANSFORMATION THROUGH UNIVERSITY RESEARCH

The University of Nueva Caceres proudly hosted the first-ever regional student research summit in Bicol, NurTURe 2025, held on May 23, 2025, at the UNC Social Hall. This pioneering event was organized by the UNC Research Center, and brought together 13 academic institutions from across the Bicol Region to celebrate and advance transformative student research.

A total of 59 research papers and 63 research posters were presented, representing a broad spectrum of innovative and socially relevant topics. The summit served as a platform for emerging scholars to share their work, engage in critical dialogue, and contribute to academic and societal development. The summit was highlighted by a compelling plenary address delivered by Dr. Margarita Felipe-Fajardo, who spoke on the theme of Transformational Research, inspiring attendees with insights on how evidence-based inquiry can drive meaningful change.

SDG 17: Partnerships for the Goals


These sessions showcased the creativity, dedication, and intellectual rigor of the youth as they tackled contemporary global issues through academic inquiry.



Skills workshops focused on employability and professional growth





## PIECE OF HISTORY:

# **UNC MUSEUM ACQUIRES SIGNED 1939 EXECUTIVE ORDER** BY PRESIDENT MANUEL L. QUEZON

The University of Nueva Caceres Museum proudly announces the acquisition of a rare and significant historical artifact: an original, signed copy of Executive Order No. 217, issued in 1939 by President Manuel L. Quezon.

This Executive Order prescribes "Certain Civic and Ethical Principles to Be Taught in All Schools in the Philippines," mandating the integration of values education into the national curriculum. It emphasizes the development of moral character, personal discipline, civic conscience, and the responsibilities of citizenship among Filipino learners—principles that remain deeply relevant today.

This remarkable document, along with other archival materials from the Commonwealth era, is now preserved and available for scholarly viewing at the UNC Museum Archive Room.

We invite the UNC community and the public to explore this important piece of our national history—a testament to our enduring commitment to education, civic virtue, and cultural preservation.
